Background:

The overarching goal of this program is to reduce the burden of commercial tobacco use and exposure to second-hand smoke among the American Indian population in the IHS Albuquerque Area. The Albuquerque Area Southwest Tribal Epidemiology Center (AASTEC) Good Health and Wellness in Indian Country Program is offering three (3) tribal sub-awards of up to \$10,000 each to test, implement, and evaluate ONE commercial tobacco prevention/control activity in tribal communities, including:

1. Conducting a community-wide scan to examine access to commercial tobacco products, existing marketing of tobacco products, environmental tobacco smoke exposure, and existing commercial tobacco-free policies in the community and identify priorities for intervention; or
2. Implementing comprehensive commercial tobacco-free policies or other system/environmental interventions to protect tribal members from secondhand commercial tobacco smoke, decrease exposure to commercial tobacco marketing and reduce the availability of commercial tobacco products.
